



Notice of Availability of the North Carolina Central University 2021 Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Program (DAAPP) Annual Report

Substance misuse and abuse pose a significant national problem resulting in consequences such as assaultive and self-destructive behavior, property damage, and loss of life. North Carolina Central University is concerned about the harmful effects of illegal and abusive drug and alcohol practices in and around our campus community. The University is committed to establishing policies and regulations that promote a safe and healthy environment. It is the responsibility of the campus community – students, faculty, and staff – in protecting and promoting that environment, and all are expected to exemplify high standards of professional and personal conduct. In this context, we are sharing the 2021 Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Program Report as required by the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act (DFSCA).

North Carolina Central University is committed to maintaining a drug-free campus. The Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Program (DAAPP) Annual Report contains:

- Standards of conduct that prohibit the unlawful use, manufacture, possession, or illicit distribution of drugs and alcohol by students and employees,
- A description of legal sanctions for the violation of local, state, and federal laws for unlawfully possessing, or distributing drugs and alcohol,
- A description of health risks associated with drug and alcohol abuse,
- Current drug and alcohol programs available for students and employees and,
- A statement that North Carolina Central University will enforce disciplinary actions for violations of the standards of conduct.

The Drug and Alcohol Abuse Prevention Programs (DAAPP) at the University seek to help students, faculty, and staff develop responsible attitudes toward illicit drug and alcohol use and to inform members of the university community on the repercussions of alcohol and/or illicit drug use on campus property.
