
ASBESTOS FACT SHEET



What can you do?

- Do not install screws, pins, nails or hangers into asbestos ceiling or wall plasters
- Take care not to damage walls, ceilings or floors when moving furniture or equipment
- Never dust, sweep, or vacuum debris that may contain asbestos
- Be aware of warning signs and labels

DANGER

CONTAINS ASBESTOS FIBERS
MAY CAUSE CANCER

DO NOT BREATH DUST
AVOID CREATING DUST

- Immediately report any damage or deterioration of suspect building materials to Facilities by submitting a <u>School Dude</u> work order
- Submit an <u>EHS Hazard and Incident Report Form</u> if you have safety concerns

Asbestos is a common name given to a group of naturally occurring mineral fibers

Asbestos-containing material (ACM) may be present in some older buildings on campus.

The <u>U.S. Environmental</u>
<u>Protection Agency</u> says
that ACM "that is in
good condition and left
undisturbed is unlikely
to present a health
risk."

Managing asbestos in place and maintaining it in good repair is often the best approach.
