
TRACKCLASS ATTENDANCE ONLINE

1. Verify with an Assignment

Confirm your students' initial participation in the course by requiring them to submit a participation statement, syllabus quiz, or introductory discussion post by the census date.







2. Design to Engage

Incorporate weekly due dates and check-ins that keep students connected. Consider incorporating weekly discussions, low-stakes quizzes, and knowledge checks.

3. Monitor Submissions

Enable view tracking for course content, and use the online grade book to verify submissions and consistent participation. Here, you can see when students last accessed the course.





4. Connect in Real Time

In synchronous classes, use an attendance tracker or conduct virtual roll calls. Liven up your live sessions with polling, response gaming (i.e. Kahoot), exit slips, and one-minute

5. Intervene Early

Use messaging tools such as announcements or the Remind app to stay connected. Supportively reach out to at-risk students at the first sign of limited engagement and collaboratively develop an action plan.
