Academic Success and Enrichment Services (ASES) utilizes an intrusive approach to enhance academic performance through academic resources, including tutoring, academic coaching, the writing studio and the Aspiring Eagles Academy.

Academic advisors provide academic advisement to University College students, through 1 on 1 mentoring, workshops and presentations at least two times each semester.

UNIV 1100 First Year Seminar instructors and undergraduate teaching fellows assist students in developing necessary self-care skills for successful adjustment to college.

Special Programs

3+2 Electrical Engineering

Program: This 3-plus-2 dual degree program provides an opportunity for students to earn two STEM degrees - a B.S. in Electrical/Computer Engineering/Science from North Carolina State University and a B.S. in Mathematics from NCCU.

The student would then be awarded two degrees, one from each institution.



3+4 Educational Program: A 3+4 Educational program is a seven-year dual-degree program. Students spend three years at NCCU and four years at a medical school and graduate with two degrees. Some of our Partner schools include:

- > Boston University School of Medicine
- > Howard University College of Pharmacy
- > Rutgers University School of Dental Medicine

3+3 matriculation program: The NCCU Political Science Department participates in a joint degree program with the NCCU School of Law to combine a bachelor's degree and a law degree in a six-year program. Undergraduate students who meet the criteria for the program will begin their legal education at the NCCU School of Law after their junior year and receive a bachelor's degree following their first year of study at the law school.

ABOUT

The **Cheatham-White Scholarship** is a merit-based scholarship program for students entering North Carolina Central University and N.C. Agricultural and Technical State University. This program was designed to provide an outstanding educational experience to exceptional scholars who display a wide range of interests, are proficient in areas of both the arts and sciences and demonstrate leadership potential and a strong commitment to service.

BENEFITS

This is a fully funded four-year scholarship. The scholarship covers full tuition and fees, housing, meals, textbooks, a laptop, travel and personal expenses. Each scholarship also provides four summers of fully funded enrichment and networking opportunities that may include international travel and study.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for nomination to the Cheatham-White Scholarship Program, a person must satisfy all the following criteria:

1. Be admitted as a freshman in the fall semester into a baccalaureate program at NCCU.
2. Be a United States citizen or permanent resident.
3. Be on course to graduate from high school in the spring semester prior to college admission.
4. Minimum of 4.0 or higher weighted cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale.
5. Show exceptional qualities of character and leadership.
6. Be significantly involved in extracurricular activities.
7. Demonstrate a strong commitment to service.

EXPECTATIONS

- > Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5.
- > Enroll full time each semester and earn a minimum of 30 credit hours each academic year.
- > Maintain membership and active participation in the University Honors Program.
