In addition to the health screenings and educational outreach, we were also involved in the food distribution efforts outside the church. Fresh fruits and vegetables from the food pantry were handed out to those in need, ensuring access to nutritious food.

>>> MOBILE FREE PHARMACY - LILLINGTON

On June 28th, the NC MedAssist Mobile Free Pharmacy held an event in Lillington, NC, at the Harnett County Buildings Common Area, located at 309 W. Cornelius Harnett Blvd. This event was a collaborative effort involving dedicated nursing students and faculty who provided essential health screenings and education to the community.
