Admission Requirements

- Online graduate application + \$50 fee
- Letters of recommendation
- Official transcripts from all institutions attended
- Personal Statement of Purpose
- Resume
- No GRE required

International Students Also Submit:

- TOEFL/IELTS
- Official course-by-course transcript evaluation
- Financial Statement Certificate of Eligibility + Bank Statement

Apply by These Dates

(EMPA Tracks admit in Spring and Summer only)

U.S. Citizens/Permanent Residents:

- Fall: July 1
- Spring: December 1
- Summer: April 1

International Applicants:

- Fall: April 1
- Spring: September 1


Why Should I Complete My MPA at NCCU?

Traditional MPA Track

- **Duration:** 2 years (with a typical three-course semester load)
- **Designed For:** Recent graduates or early-career professionals aiming to launch or boost a career in public or nonprofit management and anyone looking for flexible training in public management
- **Learning Model:** Primarily on-campus, face-to-face interaction and collaborative learning experiences
- **Core Focus:** Build a foundation in essential fields like Personnel Administration, Public Management, Policy Analysis, and more

EMPA Online Fast Track

- **Duration:** 1 year (12 months, in 8-week sessions)
- **Designed For:** In-Service Professionals with 5+years of experience
- **Learning Model:** 100% online cohort of approximately 20 students
- **Career Acceleration:** Mid-career professionals seeking to move into upper administrative roles or pivot into the public sector

EMP Global-Hybrid Track

- **Duration:** 18 months
- **Designed For:** Professionals with 4+ years of experience seeking to improve their skills and qualifications, expanding professional network
- **Learning Model:** Cohort-based, students work through the program together and meet monthly
- **Global Exposure:** A two-week international internship built into tuition
