



## Academic Engagement & Support

**Academic Advising (University College)** Providing academic advisement for first year, sophomore and transfer students with less than 52 credit hours to support their career, educational, and life goals, as well as help students understand resources, curriculum plans, academic standards, and graduation requirements.

### Academic Success Coaching

Academic coaching regularly provides support throughout the semester. Through one-on-one coaching meetings, we assist students with developing student success action plans, which act as individualized pathways for student success.

### Aspiring Eagles Academy

An academic enrichment program designed to promote the success of incoming freshmen who have been accepted at NCCU.

### Career and Professional Development Center

Online personality and career assessment, hands-on career counseling, access to NCCU-exclusive internships, jobs, and service-learning opportunities, and on-and-off site career fairs and events.

### Division of Student Affairs

The division touches each student at NCCU and curates a rich, unique undergraduate student experience.

### NCCU Libraries

James E. Shephard Memorial Library, the Music Library, the Curriculum Materials Center (CMC), the School of Library and Information Sciences (SLIS) Library, and the School of Law Library.

### Office of Community Engagement and Service

Develops and engages community partnerships and opportunities for service experiences (e.g., direct service, faculty-led alternative break experiences, global service and service-learning courses) for NCCU students, faculty and staff.

### Office of Student Advocacy

Offers guidance, resources and referrals for students who are experiencing difficult situations that impact their academic and personal success.

### Office of Transfer Services

Seeks to educate, engage and establish excellence by providing transfer students the resources they need to become productive members of the NCCU community.

### Office of the Registrar

Supports North Carolina Central University students, academic advising, instructional efforts, and research activities using the best practices available.

### Residential Life

Offers living arrangements and support for students living both on and off campus.

### Scholarships and Student Aid

Aims to provide financial assistance to students through scholarships, grants, loans, and work-study.

### LCI-Student Accessibility Center

Provides accommodations and support services to NCCU scholars with a learning difference, disability (physical, learning, or psychological), and/or with a medical condition.

### Student Engagement & Leadership

Provides programs and services that support student's leadership development, cultivate seamless learning experiences, and promote meaningful engagement.

### Student-Athlete Academic Support

Create an environment that will allow student-athletes the opportunity to maximize their academic, personal, and social growth.

### TRiO & Student Support Services

Provide intrusive support & quality services with the objective of increasing retention & graduation rates for first-generation college students from low-income families & students with documented accessibility needs at NCCU.

### Tutoring Services

Tutorial services are offered throughout University College. For the students' convenience, tutoring sessions are held in various locations across the campus.

### University Testing Center

Computerized Placement Tests (ACCUPLACER), Computer-based interest and personality assessments, Web-based testing, and Scanning and scoring test documents, surveys, and questionnaires for faculty and regional secondary and post-secondary institutions.

### Writing and Speaking Studio

The mission of the Writing Studio is to support your learning and work as a writer in the university community through one-on-one and small-group collaborative sessions.

## Health & Wellness

**Campus Pantry** The NCCU Campus Pantry is a free resource for NCCU students, faculty, and staff that provides nutritional support for food insecure individuals.

### Recreation and Wellness
