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Handbook Policy: Day 1.05 - 01

- After the first year, students with a 2.34 GPA or higher may take 16 credit hours. Students who want to take 17 hours must have approval from the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs.
- After the first year, students that have not met the 2.34 GPA threshold may only take 13 credit hours per semester and will be subject to additional restrictions.

Evening 1.05 - 03

- After the first year, students may take between 8 and 10 credit hours. Students who wish to take fewer than 8 credit hours must have approval.
- After the second year, evening students with a 2.34 or better are cleared to take 12 credit hours but must have approval to take more credit hours.
- After the second year below, evening students who have a GPA below 2.34 are cleared to take 10 credit hours.

Course Overloads 1.05 - 04

- Student must seek approval for overloads. The request should state the student's name, the number of credit hours of the additional class, the reason for requesting the overload, their overall GPA, and whether their advisor approves.
- Students must have at least a 3.0 GPA and can demonstrate that the additional credits will not hinder the student's ability to maintain their GPA.

Academic Eligibility 1.10-11

- Day students must maintain a 2.0 GPA or better or will be dismissed after their first year.
- Evening students must maintain a 2.0 GPA or better or will be dismissed after their second year.
- Day students with less than a 1.4 GPA after the Fall semester will be dismissed.
- Evening students with less than a 1.4 GPA after the first year will be dismissed.
- Day Program or Evening Program students with less than a 2.0 GPA after the academic year will be dismissed.

Readmission 1.11-01

- Day Program or Evening Program students with at least a 1.8 GPA are eligible to return.
- Petitions for readmission for students with a minimum 1.8 GPA upon dismissal will not be considered until one academic year after a student's dismissal for substandard academic performance.
